WELCOME BACK!

Welcome back to Term Three! The year is going by quickly and the enthusiasm is high for an exciting term ahead. There are lots of school events coming up this term so please take note of the important dates and ongoing communication on Compass.

Little Learners Love Literacy

This term in literacy students will move into stages 4+, 5 and 6 which focus on graphemes made of 2 or 3 letters. Students will be building on their writing and reading skills by practising blending adjacent consonants in words and reading longer words with more than one syllable. We continue to focus on independent writing at a word, phrase and sentence level focusing on punctuation and correct grammar.

Top10 Maths

This term in Maths students will be able to gain a stronger understanding of place value up to 100, skip counting by 5's, 10's and 2's, explore subtraction, read the time and look at probability and chance. We encourage you to participate in ongoing number exposure at home with your child. Whether that is through writing numbers, counting patterns, playing various games, cooking or measuring.

Inquiry- Science and Geography

This term we focus on defining and identifying places we belong to. Students will learn and describe features of places and changes in these, at a local scale. We will identify how people are connected to different places and explain the personal value of places to people.

We will also be learning about moving objects with a focus on push or pull. Students will explore how an object's changing shape impacts its movement.
