The curriculum emphasizes "swimming and water safety" through four key areas: developing fundamental movement skills like floating, addressing safety practices near water and in daily life, promoting swimming as a lifelong physical activity, and encouraging participation in challenge and adventure activities like swimming for performance. Students will participate in this in December.

#### LITERACY

This term students will focus on both persuasive and narrative writing this term. They'll learn how to craft convincing arguments in their persuasive pieces, while also exploring creative storytelling through narrative writing. Our literacy program also includes Café Reading sessions, where students will engage with a variety of texts and apply the 12 key comprehension strategies to deepen their understanding. These activities aim to enhance both their writing skills and reading comprehension, setting a strong foundation for effective communication.

#### **Numeracy**

This term students will be exploring a range of key topics. We will dive into fractions and decimals, helping students understand how to compare and work with these numbers in practical ways. We'll also explore chance, discussing probability and real-life examples. Students will develop their skills in reading time, identifying angles, and understanding transformations in geometry. Additionally, we will focus on mass and capacity, using hands-on activities to measure and compare different objects. These topics will provide a strong foundation in various mathematical concepts.

#### Homework

It was great to see so many students complete their homework last term. We focused on Reading, Comprehension, Spelling, Number and Algebra, and Statistics, aligning with our curriculum. Homework helps students apply what they've learned independently, reinforcing their skills through practice. We're encouraging home reading at least four nights a week to boost comprehension and fluency. Homework will continue to be due every two weeks on a Friday.
